The students of Gajaba Vidyalaya went to Kandy. They went to see the Kandy Perahera. They wrote about it for the class wallpaper.





The Kandy *Perahera* is a beautiful pageant. It is in August. King Keerthi Sri Rajasinghe started it first.

First, you hear the whip crackers cracking their whips. They lead the *Perahera*. The flag bearers, sword carriers and fireball acrobats come next. *Peramunerala* and *hewisi troupes* follow them. Some *Nilarnes*, drummers and Kandyan dancers are next in line. The Kandyan dancers add beauty to the *Perahera*.

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The tusker carries the Sacred Tooth Relic. The *Diyawadana Nilame* and other *Nilames* follow the tusker. Over a hundred elephants take part in this event. The four *Dewala Peraheras* go after that. The *Perahera* lasts for more than three hours. People around the world come to see it.

Ask one member of each group to come and select a word, read it and paste it on the correct board with the similar sounding word. Once they all have finished pasting, the teacher can check. For each correct word, the teacher can paste a green dot. The team that gets the highest number of green dots will win.

# Lesson 6 Let's play "Classroom Shopping".



Students are going to walk around the classroom having shopping conversations with other students and buying objects with money.

You'll need some toy money for this game.

Start by telling everyone they must put three of their personal items on the table in the front of the class. Anything will do – pens, books, pencils, rulers etc. Then take out the shopping bags and randomly put the students' items into the bags, so that each bag has three different items in them. Make sure students don't see which bags you put their items in.

Now, give each student a bag and ask them to look inside their bag. If anyone has any of their own personal items in their bag they must bring them back to the table at the front, and then put them in different student's bags. The idea is to make sure each student has a bag with three items in, none of which are their own.

Tell students that they must find their items and buy them back!

Divide the toy money so that everyone has the same amount.
